Interfaith Matters

I work often in a local Op Shop with a Muslim woman whom I talked with during Ramadan about how this very special Muslim festival was for her — expecting she would talk about hunger. She spoke so positively I asked if she would prepare a comment about what Ramadan meant and how it affected her and her Muslim community. Here it is....



Ramadan is the most holy month in Islam commemorating when the Quran was sent to Prophet Muhammad, peace be upon him. Worldwide in that month Muslims are expected to fast from dawn until dusk. Before sunrise, Muslims wake up to eat a meal called 'Suhoor,' which prepares them well for the day of fasting. They break their fast with family and friends at a meal called Iftar, eating and praying afterward. Ramadan is a month of discipline during which people work on their relationship with God and get closer to Him. As well as this, they feel the spirituality and closeness within the community, deepening their faith and personal connections.

So, Muslims feel not alone, myself included, but rather we sense the positives and closer bonds with the community and with God. Ramadan is known for boosting the spirit of giving and thankfulness. Fasting in Ramadan is not just about food and water but rather about working to become better people by acquiring patience and giving charity to those who are less fortunate. In addition to the five daily prayers, which are part of the core of Islam, Muslims go to the mosque and spend a couple of hours praying the Tarawih, a unique nightly prayer that is done specifically during Ramadan. On the last 10 days of Ramadan, people focus on performing many prayers and acts of worship, especially on the evening of the 27th day, known as Laylat al-Qadr, or the Night of Power. It is believed that God revealed the first chapter of the Quran to the messenger Muhammad, peace be upon him, on this night.

At the end of Ramadan, and after Ramadan finishes, all Muslims around the world celebrate Eid al-Fitr, which marks the end of the Month of Ramadan where families and friends gather for festive meals in the morning and spend the day together. It is all a very blessed time.
